

TO OUR FAMILY

A LETTER FROM DANIEL PAK

It was the morning of July 5, 2010. I remember Thadd and I pulling up into the Rainier Community Center parking lot, our eyes fixed on the group of young folks gathered out front. We had no idea that these ten young men, who we'd spend 250 hours mentoring and producing music with over the next two months, would be the first participants in what would one day be called Totem Star.

It took weeks to build trust. "A Black and an Asian?" one of them commented. "This \$#*t is 'bout to be hella weak." Another challenged me openly about the "work training" stipend they were each receiving versus what he speculated Thadd and I were being paid. "Just cause you make more than us doesn't mean we need to listen to you," he said, looking me in the eye.

Thadd and I would drive home every day, ranting about each of the young men as if they were our own children. The conversations would go late into the evening. We couldn't stop thinking about Antoine, K'Breyan, Shaun, and the rest of our new family.

A few weeks in, it happened. K'Breyan picked up a pencil and paper and started writing. He just sat there and wrote. He walked over to the mic, Antoine hit record, and that was it. The first Totem Star single, "Crazy," was officially in production. De'vonte' starting writing. Then Karl. Then Maika. From that point on, it was just work. Take after take. Feedback then more takes. Antoine received a phone call during the session. "Can't talk right now," he said. "I'm at work." Two weeks later we're all sitting in the large conference room in City Hall, Mayor McGinn calling in all of his staffers for a "listening party."

At the end of August, after spending 250 hours in that tiny recording studio at Rainier Community Center, we had completed an entire mixtape of music. We brought in a professional photographer, hired a graphic designer, and manufactured 1,000 copies of the Reality Mixtape. We're talking CDs, as Apple Music and Spotify didn't exist yet.

The guys were so proud. They achieved something together that not one of them could have imagined when we met on that first day in front of the building. We began the work training program with ten and we ended with ten. Unfortunately, two weeks later, we received news that a third of them had been rebooked into detention.

And that was the moment. That was when Thadd and I realized we would not, could not stop until our young people had a safe space to gather, make music, build community, and feel loved and appreciated.

Walking through the construction site at King Street Station today in the summer of 2023, watching drywall slowly cover metal framing in our new 2,000 sq ft recording studio and home, I hope we can reconnect with many of those first ten young men, now probably in their thirties, and show them what they helped build. Some are sadly no longer with us, and we dedicate this new home to them. Because it will always be their home, too. No longer will any of them have to ask for permission.

Late 2023 marks a new 30-year lease between Totem Star and the City of Seattle, via the Cultural Space Agency. Our new home is almost a reality. You all helped build it. Now help us build the next thirty years. For Antoine. For K'Breyan. For Shaun. And for every young artist who walks through our door searching for a song and a family.

Thanks for being part of our musical family. We are Totem Star. All of us. All together.

Totem Star is partnering with the City of Seattle and the Cultural Space Agency to build a new recording studio and creative home for our young people at King Street Station in the heart of Seattle's vibrant downtown center between Pioneer Square and the International District.



The new studio at King Street Station will have:

- 8 times more space to serve our youth
- Common areas for group gatherings
- Multiple studios for learning and practicing recording skills
- Flexible creative space for teaching music video-related skills
- Greater access to public transportation

Totem Star supports a diverse community of young recording artists learning music and life skills through mentorship and meaningful relationships. Our work in the studio and on the stage fosters growth in collaboration, leadership, and self-identity.

Totem Star envisions a more just society where all young people have access to music learning opportunities and youth voices are championed in support of healthy, engaged, and productive young people using music as a universal language.





PARTNERSHIPS

Partnerships is a program where Totem Star Artists and staff partner with other organizations to speak, teach a program, or facilitate a workshop on music. We've partnered with orgs such as Middle College and The Beacon Academy this past year.



TLC

Totem Star Leadership Collective is a youth advisory board that provides valuable insight into Totem's Star's programs, structure, policies, and communications while also gaining leadership experience and knowledge of the inner workings of nonprofit governance. Their work includes providing input on studio policies and ensuring implementation, raising questions and suggesting edits to existing policies and guidelines. PROGRAMS



THE STUDIO

The Studio is the creative heart of our programming, where our artists book weekly studio sessions to work with Totem Star artist mentors. Artists and mentors collaborate to work on songwriting, vocal technique, beat making, mixing, mastering, music business, performance, movement, and more.

THE STAGE

The Stage is a series of in-person arts showcases open to the general public where youth perform their original music and learn about live performance in the process. We currently have our annual showcases, Winter Magic and Summer Kickback, as well as our quaterly open mics.

LAVENDER

Lavender Sessions is a space for Totem Star artists of marginalized genders, including women, non-binary folks, and trans men ages 14-25 to convene to share music and stories, and provide mutual support and care for one another. Our gatherings range from self-defense workshops to discussions on collective care.






ARTIST BOOKING

Performance opportunities in the community with organizations such as the Seattle Art Museum, Gates Foundation, Seattle Public Schools, ACES, and more. Totem Star manages contracts for our artists and we are able to either advocate for and negotiate fair pay from partners or pay artists directly.






